Pastor's column

Beneath the Cross of Jesus

Wednesdays during Lent we will gather for a meal and then a service using Holden Evening Prayer. The meal begins at 5:00 pm with worship at 6:30 pm. The scripture and short message will center around the hymn "Beneath the Cross of Jesus."

We live our lives beneath the cross of Jesus. The cross shapes our lives as Christians, because the cross tells us just how deeply God loves us. We live each day beneath this love, God's all- encompassing love and grace that reach to us even from Calvary. Wednesdays during Lent we will explore what it means to live beneath the cross of Jesus.

February 17 – "Beneath the cross of Jesus I long to take my stand." What does it mean to abide at the foot of the cross? How do we stay strong in our faith? As he faced death, Jesus tried to prepare his disciples for what was to come. He knew it wouldn't be easy and so Jesus proclaimed to the disciples and to us, "Take courage; I have conquered the world (John 16:33b)!" You are invited to bring a cross from your home to the worship service.

February 24 – "The shadow of a mighty rock within a weary land." How often do we cling to the rocks of wealth or prestige or anything else to which we can cling, only to learn these are shaky foundations on which to build our lives? God alone is our rock and our salvation. We cling to God, our rock. "Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house...(1 Peter 2:5a)."

March 2 – "A home within a wilderness, a rest upon the way." is your home? Perhaps a farmhouse, an apartment, a house that's been in your house for generations, or a house only a few years old that only you have lived in. Wherever our earthly homes lay, our true dwelling place remains with God. "So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you're a citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God. (Ephesians 2:19)." On this night we will include a "Blessing of the Homes" as part of the service.

March 9 – "From my contrite heart, with tears." From the depths of our hearts we cry to God, confessing our sins. Even from the cross, Jesus cries, "Father forgive them!" We are surrounded by grace, showered with the forgiveness and love of God shown to us at the cross. "God is light and in him there is no darkness at all (1 John 1:5b)." Let us walk in God's light, forgiven and free.

March 16 – "I take, O cross, your shadow for my abiding place." How does abiding at the foot of the cross change our lives? Jesus calls us to take up our cross and follow him into a world desperately in need of a rock, a home, and forgiveness.

I hope you will come and enjoy a simple meal with your family and friends at AES Ministries. Stay for worship and enjoy the soothing and peaceful music and words of "Holden Evening Prayer." I think you will find it both inspiring and a great middle of week boost.





AES MINISTRIES JOINT COUNCIL MEETING – January 6, 2016

The Joint AES Council met on Wednesday, January 6, 2016, 7:30 pm at Augustana. The following were present: Rick Carlson, Ruth Haler, Deanna Hoffman, Wayne Jurgens, Greg Thulien, Ruth Haler, Pr. Kathleen, and Susan Anderson. Cindy Torkelson, Sandy Berg, Dale Anderson, and Teresa Andrews were absent. Visitor: Judy Thulien

Greg Thulien, in the absence of Cindy Torkelson, opened the meeting with a devotion entitled "Are You Winterized?" followed by prayer.

Judy Thulien presented and explained the Pastor's salary proposal. These figures changed after the insurance quotes were finalized and received. After some discussion, a motion was made and seconded to set the Pastor's salary at Step 10 according to Synod guidelines. This motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pr. Kathleen has been busy during the Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas seasons. She welcomes being busy. After following proper protocol with our Synod and the Presbyterian Church, Pr. Kathleen received permission to conduct a funeral at the First Presbyterian Church in St. James.

DOFFM:

Rick Carlson informed us that the Family Sunday School will be held at East on April 24th.

Bible School is being planned for one of the first weeks in August. It has been suggested that the Annual Church picnic be held on the Sunday at the end of Bible School – thus combining Bible School and the picnic. The children will be part of the service that morning. Setting the date was tabled until the 2016-2017 starting school date was known. The entertainment that has been asked to be at the picnic will need to be notified when a date is set.

The times of the events on the day of the Valentine's Dinner were discussed. It was agreed by all to move the East worship time to 10:00 am on Sunday, February 14th in order that East members can get back to Augustana in time for the noon dinner.

OLD BUSINESS:

Council members reported that members of all three churches were very impressed with the Joint Thanksgiving Service. All the feedback was positive. The Pastor recommended that this service be held again in 2016. A motion was made and seconded to continue the Thanksgiving service with First Presbyterian and the United Methodist churches with the service at First Presbyterian and Pr. Kathleen preaching in November 2016. This motion carried.

All agreed that the Advent and Christmas services were well received. The 4:00 and 5:30 pm service times work well. It was decided to keep with this schedule in 2016. Thank you to Terry Engel for the Advent candle lighting liturgy.

Ruth Haler was thanked for the post cards that were sent at Christmas time. Council members shared that they had heard many good comments about them.
